1

Set up a Fundraising page

The easiest way to raise money at your event is by using the online fundraising page you will have automatically setup when registering. All the money will be transferred to Doncaster & Bassetlaw Teaching Hospitals Charity automatically meaning you can kick back and relax! Simple. Make sure you add a photo, an intro to explain what you're doing and why, and set yourself a fundraising target!

Pick a date

The nation will be awash with tea on 5th July, in celebration of the birthday of the NHS. If the 5th July doesn't work for you, select a date any time that week.

Invite your invi-teas!

Along with this guide, we've included a digital poster which you can print and put up at work or in your local community. If it's a private event, invite people by email, WhatsApp or social media.

Share your page

Share your online fundraising page at your party so people can donate, and why not share it with those who weren't able to make it so they can donate in lieu of attending?

A game like 'guess the number of tea bags in the jar' is a great way to add an extra splash of fundraising to your tea party.
